The Center hosts English classes, distributes donated materials to those in need and connects arrivals with social and employment agencies. They also work with young people in multiple ways.

b) Legal training to let the Haitian community know their legal rights.

c) Haiti is not yet safe for Haitians to return or be sent back.

d) Employment opportunities, especially for the recently arrived.

e) Funds to support Center sponsored community activities.

SVdP suggests a "general donation" to allow St. Vincent's flexibility in meeting great and changing needs. For example, Springfield St. Vincent's has regular requests for distribution of new beds. SVdP provides food, clothing, rent, utilities, and other emergency assistance. Birth certificates are available for all people in need. Diapers and formula are provided for all children in need.

Passports are provided for American-born immigrant children. Legal referrals and limited assistance are provided for immigrants seeking guardianship/POA changes.
